Agency overview

Taronga Conservation Society Australia (Taronga) forms part of the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW) Cluster and the Environment and Heritage Group. Primary purpose of the Taronga Volunteer roles

Primary purpose of the role

As a Taronga Wildlife Express Train Volunteer, you will help create a fun, safe, and engaging experience for guests aboard the Wildlife Express. You will assist the train driver by supporting guests with boarding and alighting, opening and closing gates, delivering informative commentary and safety & welcoming messages during the journey and ensuring a memorable experience for all visitors. This role involves using a PA system inside the train and operating a two-way radio as required.

Key accountabilities

- Greet and welcome guests to the Wildlife Express, ensuring a friendly and inclusive atmosphere.
- Represent Taronga in a positive and professional manner.
- Provide excellent customer service to enhance the experience of our guests.
- Support the Train Driver in facilitating safe entry and exit from the train.
- Use the train's PA system to deliver scripted safety, welcoming and departing announcements.
- Deliver engaging and informative commentary on Taronga's conservation programs and animals.
- Operate swing gates at stops to facilitate safe guest movement.

Key challenges

- The Wildlife Express Volunteer Conductor role is available 7 days per week, Monday to Sunday excluding the Easter Long Weekend and between Boxing Day and early January.
- Demonstrating a good level of fitness and the ability to work in all weather conditions, including navigating uneven terrain and frequently entering / exiting the train cabin up/down a step.
- Manually operating a large swinging gate as required.
- Assisting guests with mobility issues for families, enabling the driver to load and unload wheelchairs
 & prams



- Maintaining vigilance and awareness of safety concerns, particularly in shared guest areas and during train operations.
- Using a two-way radio effectively, adhering to appropriate etiquette and Taronga's Emergency Response Plan.
- Managing crowds, queues and guest expectations, especially on busy days.
