The Education Centre at Taronga Western Plains Zoo aims to help students to develop a positive attitude towards animals, conservation and the environment. This, plus more can be achieved through all KLA's and grades.

Taronga Western Plains Zoo provides an 'outdoor classroom' which enables students to encounter a wide variety of animals and habitats that resemble their own environment.

The Education Staff provide support for teachers when planning an excursion to the Zoo through lessons, resources and information relating to the Zoo and environmental issues in general.

Please note: All school groups must be booked through the Education Centre whether a lesson is required or not.

LESSONS

Lessons are available to all visiting school groups and are included in the entry price to the Zoo. Bookings in advance are required through the Education Centre. It is essential that lesson times are met promptly.

Lessons are tailored to meet the needs of individual schools. This allows for the lesson and excursion to supplement units of work in all KLA's across the curriculum.

Lessons are approximately 45 minutes in length however, they can be varied through consultation and availability of time. Please note, however, that lessons in the Education Centre are formal lessons and are for students and supervising teachers only. Please ensure you arrive at the education centre 10 minutes prior to your lesson time.

Our Lessons are delivered Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday (excluding Wednesdays). We facilitate four Lessons per day (please see below for Lesson times)

LOCATION OF FDUCATION CENTRE

The Education Centre is located straight through the front gate, turn right at the roundabout taking the third exit you will see the silver building along with a windmill which is the Amarti Environmental Education Centre.

Payments for visit must be made at the Savannah Visitors Plaza prior to lessons at the Education Centre.

GENERAL ENTRY FEES

Kindergarten / Infants / Primary / High and Private Schools

Local Children pay \$8.00

Children pay \$14.00 (GST free)

Each which includes a lesson if they book in advance through the Zoo's Education Centre. Teachers and accompanying adults are free under the following ratio;

1:5 Infant Students

1:10 Primary/High School Students

Any parent or adult above these ratios who are not teachers should pay the group rate which is \$35.20 (GST free).

Taronga Zoo and Taronga Western Plains Zoo will only accept payment on the day or prepayment for all Education Bookings.

All excursions / bookings must be either prepaid by cleared funds prior to your booking date or paid for on arrival by cash or cheque.

Alternatively, teachers will be able to provide credit card details at the time of arrival if they are unable to provide a cheque from the school.

Please note, if fewer students attend the zoo than were booked, cash change will be provided to the teacher at admissions after student numbers have been counted and payment received.

GFTTING AROUND

Adventure, we recommend getting out of the car and exploring the Zoo on foot, bike or cart. Bikes and electric carts are available for hire and a fun way to get around, but visitors are also welcome to use their own cars or bikes.

**Please note due to safety guidelines scooters and skateboards are not permitted to be used on the zoo circuit.

Getting around by car

The Zoo features a 6km one-way circuit, with animal exhibits and picnic grounds situated along the way. Most exhibits can be seen from the road, but a few require you to walk a short distance. The Zoo circuit is a sealed road and road rules apply at all times.

If you are towing a caravan or trailer please stop at the designated parking area on the right after you drive through the main entry gate. Please unhook and park your trailer or caravan in this area as these are unable to be taken onto the Zoo circuit.

Around the circuit, there is plenty of parking so you can leave your car and explore our paths and trails on foot.



GETTING AROUND BY CART

For the ultimate zoofari experience, hire an electric cart. Our carts are a fun way to journey around the Zoo and are easy to park and hop on and off at the different exhibits, with parking available around the circuit.

Electric carts are \$69 per three hour hire. Drivers must be over the age of 21 with full driver's licence. Carts can be hired from the Hire Centre on arrival (no pre-booking). Subject to availability.

It is important to remember that the Zoo circuit is a sealed road and road rules apply at all times.

If your child requires a child restraint / car seat please be advised that the zoo does not provide these and to please provide your own. The attendant will help with fitting.

GETTING AROUND BY BIKE

Exploring the Zoo by bike is a great way to see the animals as you can easily traverse some of the paths and trails off the main circuit.

Bikes are available for hire from the Zoo's Hire Centre, but visitors are also welcome to bring their own. While the Zoo also provides helmets, it is recommended that visitors bring their own where possible.

You can arrange your bike hire at the Hire Centre on arrival, subject to availability.

The Zoo circuit is a sealed road and road rules apply at all times. The first half of the Zoo circuit has a slight incline, but otherwise it is reasonably flat.

Bike hire rates are for all day hire.



EARLY MORNING WALK

These are available most days but BOOKINGS ARE ESSENTIAL!

The two hour walks starts promptly at 7:00am (you must be at the front gate at 6:45am) and includes a guided, behind the scenes walk, which takes in a large part of the zoo, mostly Africa. Many animals are still in their night yards and therefore are very easy to see.

Cost for the walk is \$6.00 (GST Incl) per person. Zoo entry must also be added.

Breakfast packs are available and are \$8.50 (GST Incl). See catering options on Page 6 of this document.

Students then have the rest of the day to see the zoo and to work on appropriate activities.

If your visit payment has not been prepaid please ensure payment is made at the Savannah Visitors Plaza for all costs immediately after walk. You can then obtain your entry pass for the Zoo circuit.
