Food

The Greater One-horned Rhinoceros species are herbivores and eat grass, leaves and fruit.

Predators

Adult rhinos are rarely hunted by other animals, but baby rhinos can be in danger from tigers. People cutting down forests and hunting rhinos are the biggest threats.

Behaviour

Rhinos like to be alone but sometimes meet at waterholes. They make snorts and grunts to talk to each other and are good swimmers.

Greater One-horned Rhinos are amazing animals, and protecting their homes helps keep them safe for the future.

Appearance


This rhino has thick skin that looks like armour and one big horn on its nose. It is grey-brown in colour and very strong.
