There are more than **8,000 species of reptiles** on the planet, and they include lizards, turtles, tortoises, crocodiles and snakes! Reptiles breathe air, and are covered in scales, or a bony external plate, such as a shell.

Unlike birds and mammals, reptiles are unable to maintain a consistent body temperature. They lack insulation, like feathers or fur, and can't sweat or pant to cool down on a hot day. This is why you'll find reptiles warming themselves up in the sun on a cool day, and sheltering in the shade on a hot one!
