

TARONGA GREEN GRANT

Finalist Proposal Requirements

Please note you do not need to submit these with your initial application video.

Each proposal will be assessed using criteria aimed at determining the conservation benefit to wildlife. The questions below are designed to draw out comparable information on each proposal, and should be answered by each finalist. Including examples and evidence of how the proposal meets each criterion will assist in evaluation of the proposal. Any proposals that do not answer these questions will not be reviewed.

- The prize money may be given to one large project to the value of \$50,000, or two smaller projects to the value of \$30,000 and \$20,000 (\$50,000 in total).
- Submissions may be in document form (no more than 4 pages) or in audio-visual format of up to 5 minutes in duration if that better supports the concepts being conveyed (even videos must answer the questions in the application).

Cover page to include:

- Proposal Title (100 characters or less)
- Name(s) of project leaders and contact details.
- Proposal summary in 250 words maximum stating the purpose, methods and expected conservation impact of work in lay terms.

Proposal Questions

1. Please briefly describe the targeted issue and explain why this issue is a genuine threat with far reaching impact on wildlife.
2. Please describe how you would address this issue and why this is the most logical action to take. Include potential pitfalls.
3. Upon which community, habitat, species will the proposal impact?
4. Have you included indigenous perspectives/consultation in your project?
5. Please describe the specific activities you plan to undertake with clear milestones you hope to achieve and specific timelines for each milestone.
6. Please include a budget breakdown indicating how you would spend the grant money.
7. How long will the project continue to deliver benefits?
8. Does participation/support from Taronga add value to the project?
9. Who are the project partners and what value do they bring?
10. How will you measure success?
